17.5 Discontinuance of Service/Disconnection

17.5.1. Notice Requirement

Monthly charges will apply for a period of thirty (30) business days from the date the Telephone Company receives disconnect notification or until the requested disconnect date if longer than thirty (30) business days. The customer must notify the Telephone Company of a delay or cancellation in the discontinuance request prior to the disconnect date. Billing and service will then continue until the new requested disconnect date. Minimum period, early termination, and like charges will continue to apply if a service is discontinued prior to the expiration of the minimum period or service term period.

17.5.2 Disconnect Non-Recurring Charge

In addition to any other charges associated with discontinuance of services, the Telephone Company will charge a disconnect non-recurring charge to discontinue services. This charge applies on a per circuit basis. The customer shall be responsible for payment of a disconnect non-recurring charge equivalent to one (1) month of recurring charges for the Guide rate elements billed on the circuit immediately prior to disconnect. In addition to the disconnect non-recurring charge, minimum service period charges and early termination liability may apply if the circuit term or minimum service period has not been met.
